THE RESURRECTED CHRIST BRINGS US TO THIS COMMUNION WITH THE FATHER BY THE SPIRIT



On this Sunday of the Most Holy Trinity, we are all invited to the joy in Triune Holiness of God who wants us to share this holiness. It is offered to all, even to the poor sinners that we are. **Our God loves us all to the point of making us share this LIFE.** This is the good news we find in today's biblical texts.

The reading is taken from the book of proverbs. When He contemplated the universe, the ancient man was in awe of this grandiose beauty and its harmony. He saw the mark of God's wisdom and his ability. It is this wisdom of God that presides over the creation of the world. By reading this story, we understand that the true God is not the one who watches over us to catch us in default. He is, on the contrary, a God passionate about the happiness of

men. He wants their success. **God loves us and watches over us with WISDOM. Throughout our lives, we are invited to listen to GOD'S LOVE.** It is a school where we will never stop learning.

Saint Paul invites us to take a step further. He serenely deploys the faith that is rooted in His encounter with the resurrected Christ. It is in Him that we find true peace. His love was unwavering. Even in the greatest distress, nothing can shake us. He gives us HIS SPIRIT as the language of Father's love. **Even in times of distress, hope does not disappoint.** The Gospel reveals to us a God who has become close to us. He is not content to give us knowledge about what He is. He came to our encounter by His Son Jesus. He valued our human condition in all things except for sin. When we read the Gospels, we discover that Jesus is attracted to the one He calls His Father. That's where He finds His true happiness. It is gradually important that the apostles entered this revelation. **This is how Jesus reveals to us a God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, a God who is love, a God who wants the salvation of all men.**

The most important thing is not to give scholarly explanations about the Trinity but to embrace the LOVE that is GOD THE FATHER, SON, AND HOLY SPIRIT. The love we receive from HIM radiates around us. We are sent to be the messengers in this world that we need. **May Your Spirit, Lord, be upon us to welcome this love that comes from You.** May He give us strength and courage to be messengers throughout our lives.
